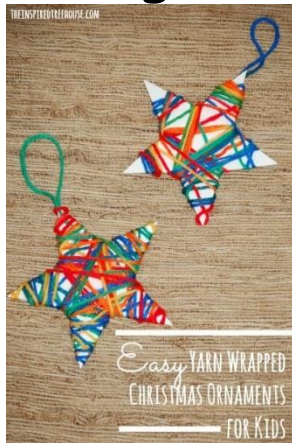

Create snowflakes out of sticks from outside, or popsicle sticks. You can glue or wrap them together with pipe cleaners or string, then decorate with markers, glitter, buttons, tissue paper, cotton balls etc... . Use your snowflakes as decorations for packages, windows or trees!

String Wrapped Stars

Make some colorful star ornaments or decorations by cutting star shapes from cardboard, foamcore, or matboard. Have fun wrapping different colored yarns around the stars in any pattern or direction you like. You can also sprinkle them with glitter or add some sparkly sequins to make them shine bright!

Sock Snow-friends



Gather a few old white or pastel colored socks to make some cuddly snow friends. Stuff the socks with polyfil, shredded paper or tissue paper. Use yarn or elastic bands to tie off the top of the sock, and divide your snow friend into two or three sections with yarn. Decorate your snow friend with buttons, ribbons or scrap fabrics. You can also glue small twigs for arms and make some festive accessories for your snow friend with recycled materials.

Hand-Made Wrapping Paper



Have fun making your own gift wrap with sheets of newsprint from packaging, or newspaper. Gather up some different mark making tools like sponges, cookie cutters, a tooth brush or hairbrush and or your fingers and hands! Use some tempera or poster paint and have fun creating your own festive wrapping paper!
